Registering to Vote Qualifications to Register to Vote To legally register to vote you must be:

- United States citizen
- 18 years old
- Resident of Clarendon County for at least 30 days before an election
- Not incarcerated for a felony conviction
- Not adjudged mentally incompetent by a court
- Not claim the right to vote elsewhere

South Carolina laws reflect that...

Any person who is convicted of a felony or an offense against the election laws is not qualified to register or to vote, unless the disqualification has been removed by service of the sentence, or unless sooner pardoned.

Service of sentence includes completion of any prison/jail time, probation and parole.

Once a person who was convicted of a felony or offense against the election laws serves his sentence, he may register to vote.

To register, the applicant must submit a new voter registration application to his county voter registration office.
